'Good News' came from

i) (Rev.) Clair – who mentioned the success of her "Singing Angels" group on Sunday afternoons (35) [a.k.a. Community Choir]

ii) (Rev.) Nick (Old Hill) – whose association with local artists for a Nativity play has led to encouraging the use of art and painting in developing links within church and within the local community

iii) (Rev.) "Old Dean" (Quarry Bank) – who was developing a 'young toddlers' drop-in group for 6<12 months to underpin their pre-school group.

3. Diocesan Priority: <u>To underpin [the other diocesan priorities]</u> by investing in our clergy and lay leaders, providing training and development opportunities to enable them to grow and feel supported and equipped for mission.

Quality training and support for our ordained and lay ministers is essential for the thriving of our churches. This evening, we will consider how we can nurture new vocations and future leaders, support those currently in training, and, of course, continue to develop and support all our ministers at every stage of their ministry.

The priority given priority at this synod was Supporting Ministers in the Diocese.

'Lay Ministry' – and how PCCs should advance and support those called to these positions. How to "recognise the nudge"." \*Memo\* Ask how successful we have been?

'Discipleship Pathways' are unique to each person – and can last for months or years, so 'be prepared' for a long slog.

Consider how we take the 'occasional worshipper' into being 'congregation' through encouragement and sharing responsibilities. Don't be afraid to give up a job to others. Remember the '80/20' analysis – of 80% on the work being done by 20% of the people.

\*Beware new Vicars and established Readers.\* and a clash of roles, insights and aspirations. !!

Kath Davis gave a good explanation of the roles of ALMs and LLMs. and their training patterns and responsibilities. How involved has your PCC been in supporting their training?

Consider also the support being given to your present Priest – question and review – particularly during inter-regnum periods. !!

(Rev.) Adam spoke of moving into Ordained Ministry and how to "join". We must each "own the traditions of our respective churches".

Within GDD some 6 priests are leaving – including our own RN after a lifetime of service, some 28 years.
